Tim and Annette's news



In June this year Annette and I celebrated our 15th wedding anniversary. We went to the Isle of Man for a holiday. We stayed at Cedar Lodge overlooking the beautiful bay of Port Cornaa.

Whilst there Annette had a troubling vision of a demon calling himself the prince of demons. He said his name was 'fear' and that he has control of God's people. Whilst being a lie there's certainly some truth in the claim.

Fear is a big problem for a whole lot of people including Christians.

Personally I give thanks to God that I have been delivered from fear (anxiety), but it has taken a long time to get to this place.

It's really important that we be not afraid. We are commanded not to be afraid of anything (Philippians 4:6), but all too often most of us are. I found that the Christian life is a life in the battlefield, and leaders are on the frontline of that battle all the time. We have to get victory over fear, and in Christ Jesus we have that victory. Making that a daily reality is what we have to do.

At the same time Annette had a word from the Lord that an adversary had been sent to buffet her, a thorn in her flesh as it were.

She began to get ill and then very ill until finally she was admitted into Scarborough hospital and stayed there for a week. The doctors told us that diabetes had returned and her blood-sugars and keytones were 'through the roof'. In addition she has bad fibroids and needs a hysterectomy soon. If you remember from our May 2016 newsletter Annette was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes in January 2016 and then miraculously healed in March 2016 and has had normal pancreas function and blood-sugar levels since then.

Just before she went into hospital the Lord told Annette that her time of buffeting was over so she refused to accept the doctor's diagnosis which was T1 diabetes once again. The endocrinologist consultant said that her period of two and half years of not injecting insulin was a 'diabetes honeymoon' and now the disease had taken hold. However within a few

weeks of coming out of hospital she had to stop injecting insulin once again because her blood-sugar returned completely to normal.

She takes her blood-sugar reading regularly like a good patient so that the doctors can see she is acting responsibly, but she has not injected any insulin for over two weeks now.



She went back to see the consultant and he is completely baffled saying "its diabetes, but not any type we know of".

We know however that it is the hand of Jesus healing her and we give him all the honour and praise!

In other news our beautiful youngest daughter Abigail was married in September to Matthew Milnes at the URC Church in Withernsea. Matt is the son of the pastor of that church and has been a friend of the family for some time.

We're really pleased that Abi has married a fellow Christian and we wish them every joy in their union. They now have a ready-made family of three girls: Sky, Page and little Sophia.
